Thundershowers cripple normal life in north K'taka dists

Two teens among four washed away in streams

KALABURAGI/HUBBALLI/ BALLARI, DHNS

Heavy showers on the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday have left a trail of destruction in north Karnataka districts. The overnight showers claimed four lives, destroyed standing crops on vast tracts of farmland and damaged houses and road infrastructure in Kalaburagi, Raichur, Bagalkot, Ballari, Vijayapura and Uttara Kannada districts.

In separate incidents, four persons, including two teenage boys, swept away in streams following heavy showers in north Karnataka districts.

Two boys, aged 15, washed away in an overflowing stream near Vishwaaradhya Temple in old Shahabad town, Kalaburagi district, on Sunday. The incident occurred when Vishwanath and Tejaswi Poornachandra, both natives of the town, had gone for a swim. The

bodies of both the boys were fished out from the stream a while later.

Kalaburagi city and many parts of the district, including Sedam, Kalagi, Jewargi and Yedrami experienced heavy showers for the second consecutive day on Sunday.

A 35-year-old man was washed away in a stream at Maski, Raichur district. Channabasappa of the town was swept away in a flash flood while answering nature's call. His friend Jaleel and two rescue personnel, who got stuck in the stream during rescue operations, were eventually pulled out of the stream with the help of a crane.

In yet another incident, Venkanagouda Saaligoudar (38), a farmer from Konnur, washed away in Malaprabha river while returning home from farm, at Govanakoppa in Badami taluk.

The swollen Malaprabha and the notorious Benne Halla stream have triggered flood

threat in several villages, including Yavagal, Surkod and Kurlageri, in Nargund taluk. Rainwater gushed into the government hospital in Nargund damaging foodgrains at Sai Dasoha kendra. Baragin Mudhol taluk recorded the highest rainfall of 13 cm.

The overflowing Hirehalla stream in Koppal taluk has created a flood-like situation in several villages including Kolur and Mangalapur.

Breach in Daroji lake and release of excess water from Narihalli reservoir have damaged standing crops on more than 350 acres in Sandur taluk, Ballari district.

The Purandara Mantap at Unesco world heritage site Hampi has submerged following the increased outflow from Tungabhadra reservoir. The river has meandered its way into Chakratheertha and Ramalakshmana temples.

The overnight downpour has wreaked havoc on many parts of Uttara Kannada, Belagavi, Vijayapura and Davangere districts. Several places in Kodagu, Shivamogga and Hassan also witnessed good rainfall on Sunday.

Red alert for coastal districts

There's no relief from showers for the coastal region. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted heavy showers, coupled with thunder and lightning, for three coastal districts for Monday and Tuesday. The IMD has sounded red alert for Uttara Kannada, Udupi and Dakshina Kannada. The formation of low

pressure area over the Bay of Bengal is likely to bring heavy rain in the coastal districts and many parts of interior Karnataka till Oct 15. Similarly, Belagavi, Bidar, Kalaburagi, Yadgir, Raichur, Shivamogga, Kodagu, Hassan and Chikkamagaluru districts are likely to receive spells of heavy rain for next 48 hours. The IMD has issued an orange alert for the aforementioned districts.

Five killed as rain lashes coastal districts of A.P.

Deep depression crosses the coast at Kakinada

In Andhra Pradesh, coastal districts of Visakhapatnam, East Godavari, West Godavari and Krishna were battered by incessant rain, as the deep depression crossed the coast early on Tuesday at Kakinada.

At least five persons were killed in three districts due to rain and flood-related incidents.

A woman and her daughter in Visakhapatnam and a man in Krishna district died due to landslips. In East Godavari's Bommuru village near Rajahmundry, one person died due to wall collapse and in Visakhapatnam, a

stream. Several mandals witnessed very heavy to extremely very heavy rainfall

during the intervening night of Monday and Tuesday.

The deep depression crossed the coast between 6.30 a.m. and 7.30 a.m. at a speed of around 65 kmph. This

caused extremely heavy rain, registering over 204.4 mm rainfall in 26 mandals of East Godavari, eight mandals of West Godavari, seven mandals of Visakhapatnam and one mandal of Krishna district in 24 hours ending Tuesday morning.

As many as 146 mandals witnessed heavy rain while 278 witnessed moderate rainfall.

Several areas were inundated due to the heavy rain and increasing flood in Godayari and Krishna rivers.

Heavy rain batters Telangana districts

Heavy rainfall was recorded across Telangana due to the impact of deep depression over the Bay of Bengal that made landfall near Kakinada in neighbouring Andhra Pradesh on Tuesday. Also, the southwest monsoon has been vigo-

rous over Telangana and north interior Karnataka.

According to the TELANGANA

Disaster Management department of the Telangana government, very heavy rainfall was recorded at a few places in Khammam and Bhadradri-Kothagudem districts and heavy rainfall occurred at some places in Khammam, Bhadradri, Mahabubabad, Suryapet, Nagarkurnool and Wanaparthy districts. A highest rainfall of over 19.6 cm rain was recorded at Vemsoor in Khammam district.

The heavy rainfall flooded vast swathes of fields under cotton and other crops

and disrupted normal life in both Khammam and Bhadradri-Kothagudem districts. The incessant rains have triggered flash floods in

Wyra, Munneru, Pedda Cheruvu, Rathoni Cheruvu, and various other rivulets and streams across Khammam district.
