Centre allocates Rs 577 cr to K'taka for natural calamities

NEW DELHI, DHNS

The Narendra Modi government, on Friday, approved the release of Rs 4,381.88 crore to six states, including Rs 577.84 crore for Karnataka, as central assistance to deal with the aftermath of natural calamities, like cyclone, flood and landslides during the year.

A decision to this effect was taken at a High-Level Committee meeting headed by Home Minister Amit Shah.

Besides Karnataka, West Bengal, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Sikkim have also received the cental assistance.

Karnataka has been given Rs 577.84 crore to deal with the damages due to flood and landslides during the South-West Monsoon while Rs 611.61 crore has been allocated for Madhya Pradesh and Rs 87.84 crore for Sikkim.

West Bengal has got the highest allocation of Rs 2,707.77 crore in connection with Cyclone Amphan. above the ex gratia provided

Modi had visited Bengal and Odisha on May 22 and had announced a financial assistance of Rs 1,000 crore to the former and Rs 500 crore to the latter and were released, in advance, the next day.

In addition, he had also announced Rs 2 lakh ex-gratia for the next of kin of the dead and Rs 50,000 for the injured, which was over and

Odisha was also allocated Rs through the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) and the NDRF.

In all the six states, an official statement said, the Central Government had deputed Inter-Ministerial Central Teams immediately after the calamities, without waiting for the receipt of a memorandum from the affected state governments.

In addition, during the financial year 2020-21, the Centre has released Rs 15,524.43 crore to 28 states from the SDRF till date.

Sunday evening rain in many areas, more likely in next 2 days

BENGALURU, DHNS: Several parts of the city received moderate to slightly heavy rainfall on Sunday evening. The met department has forecast rainfall over BBMP areas for the next two days.

The sky which remained overcast until evening gave way to heavy showers in Nagavara, Kadugondanahalli, Kaval Byrasandra and parts of Mahadevapura, with the rainfall ranging from 16.5 mm to 21 mm.

Jayanagar, Basvanagudi, BTM Layout, Banashankari and Sarakki received moderate rainfall, according to data from the Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring

Centre (KSNDMC).

RT Nagar, Sanjaynagar Hebbal, Amrutahalli and parts of Sadashivanagar also received showers.

The BBMP control room said it had not received any complaints of tree fall o casualty. "Parts of the city had received good amount of rain on Friday night, too Some places received heavy rain on Sunday but we have not received any complaint, an official said.

The KSNDMC said tha scattered to fairly wide spread light to moderate rain are likely to occur over th BBMP area for the next tw
