Mumbai: Tuesday, June 25, has been officially declared as the date of monsoon's arrival in the city this year. It is also the longest that the rains have staved away from the city in 45 years. The most late arrival date was June 28, 1974. Before 1974, the monsoon's onset had been delayed twice -June 28, 1958 and June 26, 1959. The season's normal onset date in the city is June 10.

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast generally cloudy skies

IMD said its announcement was based on rainfall over the 24 hours ending 8.30am on Tuesday. For Wednesday, the forecast is generally cloudy skies with light to moderate rainfall in the city and suburbs
