Met declares monsoon in city; the most delayed in 45 years

But Where Is It Raining, Ask Mumbaikars

Mumbai: Tuesday, June 25, has been officially declared as the date of monsoon's arrival in the city this year. It is also the longest that the rains have stayed away from the city in 45 years. The most late arrival date was June 28, 1974. Before 1974, the monsoon's onset had been delayed twice — June 28, 1958 and June 26, 1959. The season's normal onset date in the city is June 10.

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast generally cloudy skies



with light to moderate rainfall in the city and suburbs in the next 24 hours.

While announcing the season's onset, the IMD said it is rare for the monsoon to cover Mumbai after the interior parts of Maharashtra. "Gen-

erally, Mumbai gets rains before the interiors. But the Arabian branch of the monsoon was not as active as the Bay of Bengal's. Development of a low pressure system in the Bay and north-west movement of monsoon over land ens-

WEDNESDAY FORECAST: CLOUDY SKIES, LIGHT-MODERATE SHOWERS



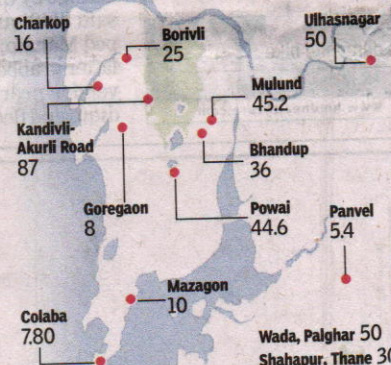
Criteria to declare arrival of monsoon over a particular region

- Wind direction must be westerly to south-westerly
- More than 50% of weather stations in the district should record significant rainfall
- Areas must experience rainfall for 3 consecutive days



Rainfall recorded in some parts of Mumbai and around in the 24 hours between 8.30am and 8.30am on June 24-25

IMD rainfall categories

Light rain 2.5mm to 15.5mm	Heavy rainfall 64.5mm to 115.5mm	204.4mm
Moderate rain 15.6mm to 64.4mm	Very heavy rainfall 115.6mm to	Extremely heavy rainfall Greater than or equal to 204.5mm

Although little rain was recorded in many areas, distribution across all weather stations has been good. We expect good rain activity in the next 2-3 days over the west coast
