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Subject:- Work-charged staff - Travelling Allowance - grant as admissible to regular government employees.

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The Government of India have had under consideration the recommendation made by the Pay Commission in paragraph 56 of Chapter XXXIV of their Report, that work-charged staffs in all establishments should be entitled to travelling allowance at the usual rates under the normal rules, like other Government ~~xx~~ employees.

The President is now pleased to decide, in supersession of all previous orders on the subject, that travelling allowance as admissible to regular government servants under the Fundamental Rules and Supplementary Rules as amended from time to time, may be granted to work-charged staffs also, at the rates laid down and under conditions and restrictions prescribed in those rules.

All the Ministries employing work-charged staffs should ensure that there is no abuse of the concession. Attention is particularly invited to the provisions contained in S.R. 64, which provides that if a competent authority declared that the pay of a particular government servant or a class of government servants has been so fixed as to compensate for the cost of all journeys, other than journeys by rail or steamer, within the government servant's sphere of duty, such a government servant may draw no allowance for journeys by rail or steamer.

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Subject:- Hospital Leave - Pay Commission's recommendation regarding.

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The undersigned is directed to say that the Government of India have had under consideration the recommendation of the pay Commission that hospital leave should be admissible to (a) all low-paid employees as also those Class III employees whose duties involve handling of dangerous machinery, explosive material, poisonous drugs etc. of the performance of hazardous tasks, and (b) industrial staff, upto three months on full pay or six months on half pay during a period of three years.

The President is pleased to decide that hospital leave may be granted to all Class IV Government servants and also to such Class III Government servants whose duties involve handling of dangerous machinery, explosive materials, poisonous drugs etc., or the performance of hazardous tasks.

2. Industrial and workcharged staff will also be entitled to hospital leave in the same manner as other Central Government servants.

3. Supplementary Rule 269 will be amended in due course.

4. In so far as persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, these orders have been issued after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General.

Subject:- Leave Travel Concession Scheme - Liberalisation of.
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The undersigned is directed to invite attention of the Ministry of Finance etc. to paras 1(10) and 4 of this Ministry's Office Memo. No. 43/1/55-Ests(A)-Part II, dated the 11th October, 1956 which lay down that the leave travel concession is to be restricted to journey by rail only and that certain categories of employees are not eligible for the concessions. These issues have been reconsidered in the light of the recommendations made by the Pay Commission and the following decisions are communicated for the information of all concerned:

(a) Industrial and work-charged staff who are entitled to regular leave will also be eligible to avail of the leave travel concession in the same manner as other Central Government employees. The first block in their case would be 1960-61.

(b) Leave travel concession will also be admissible for journeys between places not connected by rail. Such journeys should, however, be performed by the shortest road route/ steamer services. The extent of assistance from Government in such cases will be limited to what would have been admissible had the journey been by rail, in the authorised class, or 90 per cent of the 'actual expenses' whichever is less.

2. These orders will take effect from the date of their issue.

3. In so far as the personnel serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned these orders have been issued after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General.

It has been decided that, with immediate effect, the following categories of Central Government employees and members of their families will be eligible to the concessions under the Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944, and others issued thereunder, or under the Contributory Health Service Scheme:

- (a) The Government Industrial Staff (viz. the Industrial Staff working in the establishments run directly by the various Ministries/ Departments of the Central Government) and members of their families not as present covered by the Employees' State Insurance Scheme
- (b) The workcharged staff of the Central Public Works Department and other Central Govt. Departments.

2. It has also been decided that as and when the Industrial and workcharged staff and members of their families belonging to any Central Government Department/Establishment has been exempted from the application of the Employees' State Insurance Scheme and ceases to be governed by that Scheme, such staff and members of their families will automatically be governed by the Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944, or the Contributory Health Service Scheme, as the case may be, from the date of such exemption.

3. Only such workcharged and Industrial staff as have put in a continuous service of not less than one year and are employed on monthly rates of Pay, as distinct from the Casual staff or staff paid from contingencies will be entitled to the concessions contained in the O.M. under reference.

4. Pending cases may be disposed of in the light of the aforesaid clarification. Past cases which have otherwise been decided need not be reopened.
